Over the intercom an announcement will say, "Code Cherry Blossom," this will prompt available staff, residents, and visitors to line the hallways near the exits to pay respects to the resident leaving the building.

What does it mean when I see a picture of cherry blossoms on the door of a resident's room?

The cherry blossom is a symbol of the fragility and beauty of life. A cherry blossom on the door means that our team is currently supporting a resident through end of life.
















Dear Residents, Family and Friends of River Park Gardens,


