## **Definition/Description:**

Teenage Pregnancy Rate is the ratio of the number of pregnancies in teenagers aged 15-19 in a given period, to the total female population ages 15-19.

Note: Does not include multiple births.

#### Calculation:

Number of livebirths, stillbirths, therapeutic and spontaneous abortions in teenagers (age 15-19) x 1000

Total Females aged 15-19 at mid year

#### Limitations

- 1) Miscarriages (spontaneous abortions) requiring no medical intervention and abortions performed outside of Manitoba hospitals cannot be included in this calculation.
- 2) Pregnancies in teenagers under 15 are excluded from this calculation.

Teenage pregnancy rate is a measure related to the outcome of healthy children. It is considered a health indicator as teen mothers are less likely to complete hgh school and more likely to be unemployed than women who delay having children. The teen pregnancy rate reflects the number of teens and their children who may experience difficult living conditions, and indirectly may provide information on accidental or unplanned pregnancies. It is also a health determinant indicator that is used in the comprehensive Community Health Assessment for the WRHA.


Teenage pregnancy rates include all live births, stillbirths and abortions per 1000 females ages 15-19 years old. Teenagers under the age of 15 are excluded from the calculation, also excluded due to the lack of information are miscarriages requiring no medical intervention and abortions performed outisde Manitoba Hospitals.

Information is presented at the regional, community area and neighbourhood cluster levels for the period of time from 1994/1995 to 2002/2003.








# 2002/2003 Teenage Pregnancy Rate (Ages 15-19) per 1000 Females

### Highlights:

- Teen pregnancy rates in the WHR have varied between 52 and 67 per 1000 births over the period from 1994/1995 to 2002/2003.
- The overall WHR teen pregnancy rate has been declining since 1998/1999.
- There are areas within the Winnipeg Health Region that have high teen pregnancy rates compared to the Winnipeg Health Region value (up to 3 times higher than the WHR overall).
- Rates by neighbourhood cluster vary from a low of approximately 3 teen pregnancies per 1000 female teenagers to a high of approximately 175 per 1000 female teenagers in 2002/2003.
