Highlights:

- For residents of the WHR, 15.8% of the population reported being diagnosed with arthritis or rheumatism. This value is similar to those reported for Canada (15.2%) and Manitoba (16.5%).
- A larger proportion of females than males (19.7% to 11.8%, respectively) in the WHR were diagnosed with arthritis or rheumatism, which is comparable to both Canada (19.0% and 11.4%, respectively) and Manitoba (20.5% and 12.3%, respectively).
