Highlights:

- Of the WHR population, 19.6% reported experiencing an activity limitation. This percentage is lower than both the Manitoba (21.0%) and Canada (22.9%) values.
- A larger percentage of females (22.8%) in the WHR reported activity limitations compared to males (16.2%). This result is similar for Manitoba and Canada where the percentage of females reporting activity limitation was larger than for males.
