# **Youth Health Education Workshops**

**CHA REPORT 2004** 

### **Definition/Description:**

Many organizations within the WHR provide youth health education services. For the purpose of the Community Health Assessment report, the measure used for this indicator is the number of participants in youth education workshops sponsored through the *Teen Talk* Program of Klinic Community Health Centre, by place of residence.

Youth health education workshops offered by the *Teen Talk* Program of Klinic Community Health Centre are geared to adolescents aged 14-19. They address a wide variety of health-related topics including birth control, communication, decision making, dating violence, and mental health.

In 2002/03, **Teen Talk**'s health educators delivered 758 workshops at 773 different sites to a total of 14,867 participants. The place of residence of the participants is presented by Community Area in the WHR, other regional health authorities (RHAs), out-of-province, and unknown.

## **Highlights:**

- Klinic, which receives funding from the Winnpeg Regional Health Authority, provided 758 youth health education workshops in the 2002/03 fiscal year. Of the total 14,867 participants, 10,269 were determined to be residents of the Winnipeg Health Region.
- The largest number of workshop participants was in the Downtown CA (2285 or 22.3% of the WHR total), followed by Fort Garry (2073 or 20.2% of WHR total).
- The community area with the smallest number of participants was Inkster, with 115 representing only 1.1% of the WHR total.
