Definition/Description:

The indicator, Persons in Private Households, refers to a person or a group of persons (other than foreign residents) who occupy a private dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada.

Data regarding the total number of persons in private households by family and non-family persons is presented. Family Persons refer to household members who belong to a census family including spouses, common-law partners, lone parents and children. Non-Family Persons refer to household members who do not belong to a census family. They may be related to Person 1 (e.g. Person 1's sister, brother-in-law, cousin, grandparent), or unrelated to Person 1 (e.g. lodger, room-mate, employee). A person living alone is always a non-family person.
