Employment Income by Work Activity CHA REPORT 2004

Definition/Description:

This indicator refers to the average income for the population 15 years and over by work activity.

Work Activity - Refers to the number of weeks in which a person worked for pay or in self-employment in 2000 at all jobs held, even if only for a few hours and whether these weeks were mostly full time (30 hours or more per week) or mostly part time (1 to 29 hours per week).

Worked Full-time, Full-year - Refers to persons who worked 49-52 weeks, mostly full-time (30 hours or more per week) for pay or in self-employment.

Worked Part-time, Part-year - Refers to persons who worked less than 49 weeks, mostly part-time (29 hours or less per week) for pay or in self-employment.
