Definition/Description:

Education is recognized as a very important aspect of both individual and population health. It can greatly influence how we communicate and function in our communities, and also drive our employability and income levels. All individuals are entitled to a high quality education and as individuals obtain this education, they develop their potential and acquire knowledge, skills and attitudes which make them an important asset to society.

A wide range of educational opportunities can be acquired through a variety of settings. These include public, independent and home schools, and at various levels including elementary, secondary, and post-secondary. Elementary schools refer to schools that offer programs for Kindergarten to Grade 8, typically those children and youth aged 5 to 15. Secondary schools offer programs for students from Senior 1 (S1) to Senior 4 (S4), more traditionally known as Grades 9 to 12.

Method

Information pertaining to schools was obtained by reviewing various reports from Manitoba Education and Youth, Council on Post-Secondary Education and Manitoba Advanced Education.

Highlights:

Elementary and Secondary Schools

- Residents of the Winnipeg Health Region have access to 13 grades of elementary and secondary education, ranging from Kindergarten to Senior 4.
- Families have the option of choosing schools that offer specialty language programming to students such as English, Français, French Immersion, Ukrainian, German and Hebrew.
- Within the Winnipeg school system, there are six school divisions (Louis Riel, Pembina Trails, River East Transcona, Seven Oaks, St. James-Assiniboia and Winnipeg) which equates to 244 schools.
- There are also 41 Funded Independent Schools, 4 Non-Funded Independent Schools and approximately 162 Home schools.
- In total, there are approximately 455 elementary and secondary schools in the Winnipeg Health Region.
- It is important to note that school division boundaries do not align with community area boundaries.
- The Health Region boundaries, in some cases, extend somewhat beyond the school division boundaries which is true of a few schools from the Seine River School Division.

Post-Secondary Facilities

- Post-Secondary education is available to residents of the WHR and surrounding areas in a diverse range of facility types.
- Facilities numbering approximately 60, include both public and private universities and colleges, private vocational schools and public technical training institutes.
- The largest and most recognized public universities in the Winnipeg Health Region are the University of Manitoba and the University of Winnipeg.
- The University of Manitoba's main campus is located in the Fort Garry CA and its Bannatyne Campus is located in the Downtown CA.

• The University of Winnipeg's main campus, as well as its two satellite sites, are located in the Downtown CA.

- Red River Community College is the most well-known college in the WHR and is located in the St. James-Assiniboia CA, bordering on the Inkster CA. The College's satellite sites include the Princess Street Campus and Stevenson Aviation & Aerospace Training Centre.
- Manitoba Education & Youth produces a provincial directory of all schools, school divisions and districts annually. This Directory, entitled Schools in Manitoba, includes addresses, telephone and fax numbers and e-mail addresses, as well as the number of teachers, student enrollment, the grade range and language programming offered.
