

Definition/Description:

Population aged 12 and over who have consulted with a medical doctor/pediatrician in the past 12 months. Medical doctor includes family or general practitioners as well as specialists such as surgeons, allergists, orthopaedists, gynaecologists, or psychiatrists.

Highlights:

- Approximately 80% of the WHR population has had contact with a medical doctor/paediatrician in the past twelve months.
- Males in all jurisdictions consult a medical doctor less often than women in the same jurisdictions (12% - 14% fewer).
