A provincial distribution of total private and public health care sector dollars for the year 2001.

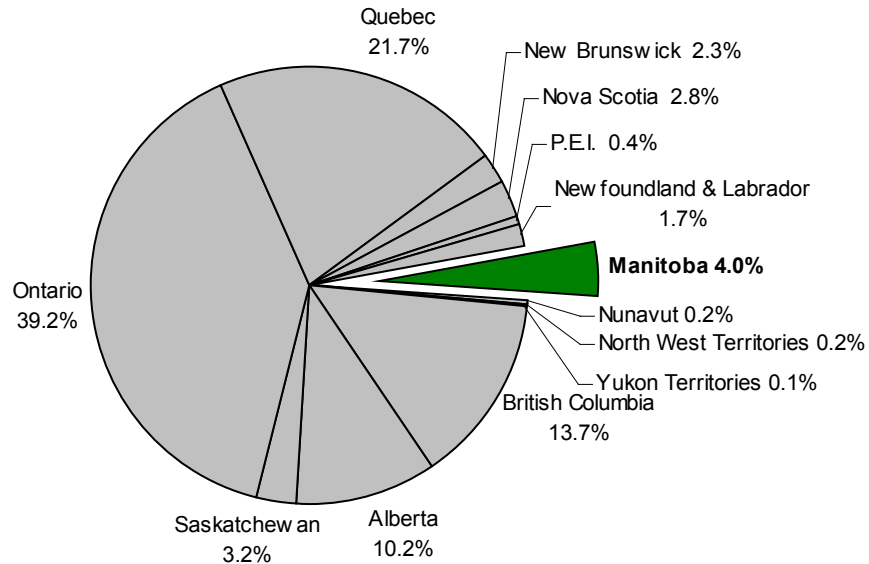

### Highlights:

- Health expenditure in Manitoba constitutes 4.0% of the Canadian total. The public sector portion of Manitoba's \$4.2 billion in health expenditure constitutes 74.5% of the Manitoba total. The remaining is contributed by the private sector in the form of private insurance, out-of-pocket expenses and non-consumption revenue such as donations and investment income.
- In 2001, Canada's total health expenditure was approaching \$106 billion.
