5-Year Mobility Status

Definition/Description:

The 5-Year Mobility Status indicator refers to the relationship between a person's usual place of residence on Census Day and his or her usual place of residence five years earlier. A person is classified as a **non-mover** if no difference exists. Otherwise, a person is classified as a **mover** and this categorization is called Mobility Status. Within the category of movers, a further distinction is made between **non-migrants** and **migrants**; this difference is called migration status. **Non-migrants** - Refers to movers who, on Census Day, were living at a different address, **but** in the same census subdivision (CSD) as the one they lived in five years earlier. **Migrants** - Refers to movers who, on Census Day, were residing in a different CSD earlier (**internal migrants**).
