Orphan Symptoms in Palliative Care

Orphan symptoms include a group of diverse symptoms which are generally under-recognized, lack robust evidence to guide management, and as a result are often inadequately treated. Despite this, these symptoms are distressing to patients and can significantly affect quality of life. The purpose of this presentation is to discuss an approach to some of the more prevalent orphan symptoms including cough, hiccups, pruritus, and xerostomia/altered taste.
