Adult Speech-Language Pathology Outpatient Swallowing Services in Winnipeg

INFORMATION FOR REFERRING PHYSICIANS AND PRIMARY PRACTITIONERS

Role of the SLP

Speech-Language Pathologists have expertise in the assessment and management of oropharyngeal dysphagia. SLPs do not assess esophageal or gastric dysfunction.

SLP will triage clients to the most appropriate assessments which may include:

- Instrumental Assessment
 - Videofluoroscopic Swallow Study (VFSS) also known as a Modified Barium Swallow (MBS)
 - Fiberoptic Endoscopic Evaluation of Swallowing (FEES)
- Non-Instrumental Assessment
 - Clinical swallowing assessment, sometimes called a bedside swallow assessment
 - Client/Family Education

Referral Eligibility

Speech-Language Pathology referral should be considered if symptoms are in the mouth and throat. For example:

- Choking event(s) that do not appear to be an isolated incident
- Frequent coughing or throat-clearing when eating or drinking
- Difficulty chewing, not due to dentition
- Food sticks in the throat
- Food stays in the mouth for a long time
- · Food or liquids spill from mouth or nose
- Extremely slow eater
- Recurrent chest infections or pneumonias
- Follow-up re: PEG tube
- Anxiety related to swallowing, resulting in avoiding certain food textures or notable decline in oral intake

*Consider a referral to Gastroenterology if symptoms are more suggestive of esophageal or gastric difficulties such as sticking in the esophagus, nausea, regurgitation or vomiting.
