

Dental Sealants

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a sealant?

A sealant is a protective clear plastic coating placed on the chewing surface of molars.

When should sealants be applied?

Sealants are usually applied to fully-erupted permanent molars after the age of six.

How do they protect the teeth?

The grooves found in these molars are a great place for plaque (germs) to hide. If these grooves are very deep, it is easy for a cavity to form. Sealants provide a smooth surface that allows for easier cleaning.

Will my child require freezing?

No. Sealants are “painted” onto a clean tooth and they are hardened with an ultraviolet light.

How long will it take?

It only takes a few minutes to apply a sealant to each tooth!

What happens if a sealant is lost?

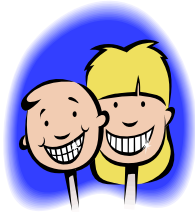
It is best to return and have it replaced as soon as possible in order to protect your tooth from a cavity!

Is it expensive?
